### UCI Title IX Student Advisory Board

- A 19-member Student Advisory Board has been established to provide input to the university on its ongoing efforts to prevent and respond to sexual violence and sexual harassment. They will provide information to students about UC's latest efforts, share students' feedback with Systemwide Title IX Coordinator Kathleen Salvaty, and help identify emerging issues. The board consists of one undergraduate and one graduate student from each campus, except for UCSF which does not offer undergraduate programs and will be represented by one graduate student
- The board members will serve until June 2019. The university will invite students to apply for the next one-year board term in early 2019
